- NOW: Review the entire New Graduate Student webpage for good information.
- MID-APRIL: You can begin to register for Fall classes in SIS for most courses.
 - Find and read the master's or <u>Graduate Student Advising Manual</u> on the <u>MatSci Current Students</u> page.
 - You will receive a request from the <u>Office of Institutional Equity</u> to complete the online Sexual Harassment Prevention training, which will require your JHED ID and password to access. Please complete this within 30 days of receiving the request.
- **BY SUMMER:** Secure off-campus housing, as the University does not offer on-campus housing. Visit the JHU Off-Campus Housing Office website for help in finding a place to live or to find roommates.
- DURING THE SUMMER:
 - Take the **Opioid Epidemic Awareness** online course.
 - Take the Effort Reporting Certifier online course.
 - Take the appropriate **Responsible Conduct of Research** course.
 - Take the online learning modules of Laboratory Safety Assessment, per the department academic advising manual. Go to my.JHU.edu > MyLearning and seek "Laboratory Safety Assessment." Finish by September 12.
- **BY JULY 16:** Contact your advisor to discuss your classes and research.
- **~JULY 29:** You will be enrolled automatically in the <u>University Student Health Benefit plan</u>. American students have the option of waiving the insurance if they have adequate coverage. Instructions will be sent by the Registrar to waive insurance or to add dependents to the insurance.
- JULY 22: Register for classes by August 27.
- LATE AUGUST: University-wide Graduate Student Orientation and Teaching Assistant Orientation
- AUGUST 22: Materials Science and Engineering Master's Orientation from 1-3 PM.
- **AUGUST 23:** Tuition is due from those paying tuition.
- AUGUST 26: First day of classes
- LATE-SEPTEMBER: Take the online course EN.500.603 Academic Ethics and Graduate Orientation before the end of the fall semester. You will be automatically registered for this course in SIS, the "Student Information System" and be notified by the Whiting School when it's available. Do not drop the course.
